New ITR forms for AY 2018-19: Things you must know before you file returns

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) on Thursday released a one-page simplified Income Tax Returns (ITR) Form-1(Sahaj) for the assessment year 2018-19, similar to that of the previous assessment year. This initiative, the CBDT said, benefitted around 30 million taxpayers who filed their returns in this simplified Form. However, this year, the tax department wants ITR assesseees to provide their salary breakup and businessmen their GST number and turnover. All the seven ITRs are to be filed electronically except for some category of taxpayers, the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) said in a statement.

Here's what Income Tax Returns (ITR) assessee must know :

The new Sahaj form wants you to disclose specific details about your salary. It seeks an assessee's salary details in separate fields and in a breakup format such as allowances that are not exempt, value of perquisites, profit in lieu of salary and deductions claimed under section 16. Though these details are provided in the Form 16 of a salaried employee, now they have to be mentioned in the tax return for clarity of deductions. Sahaj form will be used by over 30 million taxpayers.

Who has to fill Sahaj form :

Sahaj form will be filled by individuals whose income is up to Rs 5 million from the following sources:

- * Income from Salary/Pension
- * Income from One House Property (excluding cases where the loss is brought forward from previous years)
- * Income from Other Sources (excluding winning from Lottery and Income from Race Horses)
- * In case of clubbed Income Tax Returns, where a spouse or a minor is included, this can be done only if their income too is limited to the above specifications.

What is the structure of ITR 1 Form?

Part A – General Information

Part B – Gross total Income

Part C – Deductions and taxable total income

Part D – Computation of Tax Payable

Part E – Other Information

Schedule IT – Detail of Advance tax and Self Assessment Tax payments

Schedule TDS – Detail of TDS/TCS

ITR Form-2 has been rationalised :

Individuals and HUFs with income under any head other than business or profession shall be eligible to file ITR Form-2

The Individuals and Hindu Undivided Family (HUFs) having income under the head business or profession shall file either ITR Form-3 or ITR Form-4 (in presumptive income cases).

Who can use ITR-4 Sugam?

This Return Form is to be used by an individual/ HUF/ Partnership Firm whose total income for the assessment year 2017-18 includes.





- a) Business income where such income is computed in accordance with special provisions referred to in sections 44AD and 44AE of the Act for computation of business income; or
- b) Income from Profession where such income is computed in accordance with special provisions referred to in sections 44ADA; or
- c) Salary/ Pension; or
- d) Income from One House Property (excluding cases where the loss is brought forward from previous years); or
- e) Income from Other Sources (excluding Winning from Lottery and Income from Race Horses).

Who can file ITR Form-1 (Sahaj) or ITR-4 (Sugam) in paper form

CBDT said where the return is furnished in ITR Form-1 (Sahaj) or ITR-4 (Sugam), the following persons have an option to file the return in paper form:-

- An individual of the age of 80 years or more at any time during the previous year; or
- An individual or HUF whose income does not exceed 500,000 rupees and who has not claimed any refund in the Return of Income.

ITR for non-resident Indians: In case of non-residents, the requirement of furnishing details of anyone foreign Bank Account has been provided for the purpose of credit of refund.

No details of cash deposit required for ITR: The requirement of furnishing details of cash deposit made during a specified period as provided in ITR Form for the Assessment Year 2017-18 has been done away with from Assessment Year 2018-19.

Significance of Ethics in Education

Education is not knowledge alone, but also the capacity to utilize it. The quality of education depends on the ability it imparts to make proper use of the learning. In other words, acquiring knowledge coupled with the ability for its proper application is the real education. As such, the traits, which impart the skill of applying the acquired knowledge, are of great significance; without the requisite skill of application, the knowledge is a mere treasure trove in a sealed vault. Education includes all that which completes the personality of an aware and cultured citizen.

True education must, therefore, provide also the skill for application and enable development of the traits, which nurture its future growth. The ethical component of education is an element, which caters to this need. It is in the different ethical values of the knowledge makers that we find the cause for the difference in their contribution, even though they are equipped with the same level of knowledge.

The purpose of education is to produce knowledge makers with the capacity of making the most profitable use of the acquired knowledge. In his convocation





address (1922) at the Calcutta University, Sir Asutosh Mookerji, describing the aim, purpose and true functions of the University in the life of a nation, said :

“To my mind the University is a great storehouse of learning, a great bureau of standards, a great workshop of knowledge, a great laboratory for the training as well of men of thoughts as of men of action. The Positive & Negative Effects of Technology in Business

However, social media platforms can be distracting, and they can't replace face-to-face interactions when it comes to the truly meaningful actions that build strong and





resilient teams. In the Human Resources department, for example, technology can streamline benefit solutions and store and scan applications to efficiently screen prospects, but a computerized application process is rarely an adequate substitute for a face-to-face meeting to determine whether an applicant is a good fit for your company.

Organizes Information, But Needs Familiarity:

Computers store and organize information in ways that would often take human beings considerably more time. It takes seconds to pull a profit and loss statement using Quick Books, while it might take hours to compile the same report on paper by hand. The information systems you create using technology and software are only as good as the information you enter into them. Speeds Things Up, But Destroys Jobs:

Manufacturing technologies can introduce efficiencies to a business by speeding up processes that you would otherwise have to complete manually. Assembly lines improve productivity by consolidating processes and moving more quickly than humans can. However, replacing humans with machines can introduce new problems, such as a bakery mixer that mixes quickly and thoroughly but can't make adjustments for idiosyncrasies in batches of flour or the amount of moisture in the air. Large-scale automation also creates social problems by putting people out of their jobs. New technology should be implemented in conjunction with retraining programs to prepare displaced employees for doing other types of work.

Trends That Will Change Our Idea Of The Education System

According to the report issued by the New Media Consortium and the Association of Information Technology Professionals, within the next five years the education system will be determined by the following trends:

Changes in the culture of innovation :

The world is changing, and education must change along with it. Educational institutions adopt ideas from the world of business, referring to successful start-up experiences, and launch new processes. Paper routine is gradually leaving schools, ceding its place to electronic data processing. Higher education institutions have realized that technologies can become a catalyst of educational process improvement. Yet, the culture of innovation means not only acceptance of new technologies and revision of teaching methods, it also signifies awareness of the fact that values in the external world constantly change. This means education must change as well in order to meet student expectations.

Expansion of cooperation between organizations :

The number of contacts and connections between various organizations in education is growing, and technologies influence this trend in two ways. First of all, it becomes impossible not to use technologies, while the use of them is often too expensive. Therefore educational institutions open a dialogue with each other and with educational technology makers, so as to agree on advantageous terms and conditions and to influence final products. Secondly, schools and universities are beginning to share data and content more actively. Lesson notes, methodical guidelines, and class records are uploaded to the network. This is beneficial for everyone: both instructors and students. Various school blogging platforms are developed, uniting educational institutions in social media and allowing rapid exchanges of professional experiences.

Changes in the role of student assessment

Technologies make it possible to work with large data sets, e.g. to record statistics of student results and conclude which teaching methods are better. It is possible to maintain a detailed database on each student from his/her entrance to a secondary school until his/her graduation from a university in order to adjust his/her individual learning plan and draw conclusions on the education system on the whole. This shifts focus from final assessment to intermediate results that prove to be much more important for development of an education strategy. Given that the said data are accessible not





only to teachers, but to students as well, students gain more independence and control of their opportunities.

Spread of open educational resources :

Many teachers are sincerely happy to share their knowledge with the entire world, not thinking of any personal benefit. Otherwise it would be difficult to explain such a rapid dissemination of free educational materials on the Internet: courses, workbooks, learning content, research articles, and many more.

Spread of blended learning :

Owing to the information technology, a flipped classroom model has started spreading, and various forms of blended learning have emerged. Blended learning combines the best of both worlds: an opportunity to distribute time and effort freely and to acquire knowledge limitlessly beyond the classroom, as well as advantages of working with the teacher face to face. The modern trend is that more and more educational institutions count on an effective combination of technologies and traditional personal tutorship.

Rearrangement of learning spaces :

Educational institutions have started changing spaces so that students can work with electronic devices and interact more with each other. One of such rearrangement options is to place a teacher in the classroom centre with student workplaces located around the teacher, with information that would have previously been shown on a blackboard displayed on everyone's personal screens. Libraries and other spaces in educational institutions are creating individual learning places where it is convenient to work on one's portable devices.
